Glossary

Discipline – Academic area of focus with a characteristic and identifiable way of understanding and describing the human and/or natural world.

Evaluators are encouraged to assign a zero to any work sample or collection of work that does not meet Beginning (cell one) level performance

Masters concepts	Recognizes a subset of core disciplinary concepts but does not effectively apply them in a meaningful way.
